Thrombosis with thrombocytopenia syndrome (TTS) is a rare condition reported in some people who have received adenoviral vector COVID-19 vaccines. TTS is different to other more common blood clotting conditions as it is triggered by an immune response.

Having a history of blood clots, like deep vein thrombosis (DVT), does not increase your risk of TTS due to the AstraZeneca vaccine.

and your risk of getting TTS at all is less than 30 in a million.

Risk of death from a general anaesthetic is
