- 1.Applications will be considered by an Australian Academy of Science selection panel and a maximum of 10 short-listed candidates will be recommended to the Council for Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings. **The final decision regarding attendance at the 72nd Lindau Nobel Laureates Meeting will be made by the Council for Lindau Nobel Laureates Meetings.** Decisions are based upon the assessed competitiveness of the application. The Academy is not able to enter into discussion or correspondence regarding the reasons why an application is successful or not.
- 2.The registration fee for the 2023 meeting is EUR2,500 per attendee. The Academy's grant-in-aid will contribute up to AUD4,000 towards this fee for each attendee. The Academy will pay the registration fee at the conclusion of the meeting. If the final figure for the registration fee exceeds AUD4,000 after conversion the **attendee must pay the difference** to the Academy before 31 July 2023. **The applicant agrees to this condition by submission of this application form.**
- 3.The program does not provide funds for bench fees, managerial, insurance or visa costs.
- 4.All successful delegates are expected to attend a Lindau virtual briefing event organised by the Academy that will take place in May 2023, at a date to be confirmed.
- 5.All successful delegates are expected to attend the full program of events at the 72nd Lindau Nobel Laureates Meeting. Delegates will need to arrive in Lindau before the opening ceremony on Sunday 25 June 2023 and attend the full duration of the meeting including the official closing of the program on Friday 30 June 2023.
- 6.Prior to the meeting, delegates will have the opportunity to take part in a SIEF Research Innovation Tour, visiting relevant laboratories and businesses in Germany starting on Tuesday 20 June and concluding on Friday 23 June 2023. This tour is also funded by SIEF. Delegates should allow time to also attend the site visits if their application is successful.
- 7.Subject to COVID-19 travel restrictions, or other external factors, all above schedules, fees and requirements or duration of the 72nd Lindau Nobel Laureates Meeting attendance may change closer to the date.
