Frequently asked questions

Who is considered a beneficiary?

A beneficiary is seen as the Ukrainian citizen or Ukrainian permanent resident who is benefitting from the grant. In Activity 1, that is the visiting Ukrainian researcher, and in Activity 2, it is the applying Ukrainian researcher.

Can a beneficiary be a visiting researcher in an application for Activity 1, and apply for Activity 2 themselves for the same or a different project?

Yes. A beneficiary can be included in an application in Activity 1 and apply for the same project, or a different one, under Activity 2.

Can a beneficiary participate in an approved application under both Activity 1 and Activity 2?

No. A beneficiary can only participate in one Activity and cannot be awarded under both Activity 1 and Activity 2. Should a beneficiary be part of a successful application under both Activity 1 and Activity 2, the beneficiary will be able to choose which application will be awarded.

Can a beneficiary be included in more than one application under either Activity 1 or Activity 2?

No. The beneficiary must only be included in one application submitted under Activity 1 and can only submit 1 application in Activity 2.

FAQs for Activity 1

Can the Ukrainian scientist apply directly to Activity 1?

No. The grant must be applied for, paid to, and administered by the Australian organisation. The Australian organisation will be responsible for facilitating payments to the visiting Ukrainian researchers as per the executed funding agreement.

If the application is for a conference, does each visiting researcher need a separate application?

No. If the visiting researchers are attending the same conference and site visit program, and the grant is being applied for and administered by one Australian host organisation, the application can be for multiple visiting researchers.

FAQs for Activity 2

Can I apply to access a facility that's not part of the NCRIS group?

Yes. Eligible applications will be accepted for facilities that are an eligible organisation type as listed in the Activity 2 <u>program guidelines</u>. However, the Academy can only provide support in identifying an appropriate facility and providing the contact person for NCRIS facilities.
